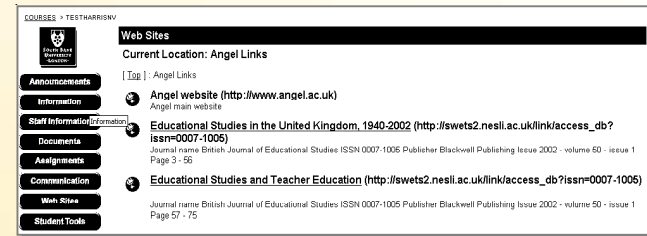
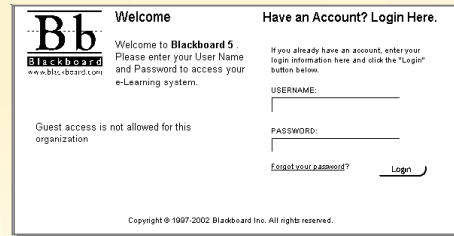


ANGEL SOLUTIONS: SCENARIO ONE KNOWING YOUR USER

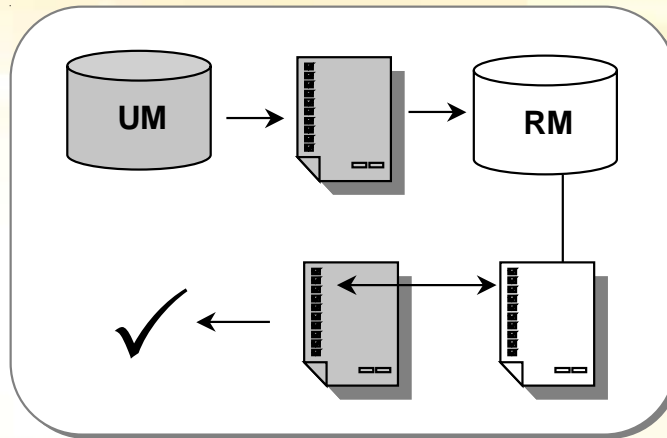
Resource access in UK HE is often hampered by the need to know and remember (or write down insecurely) a variety of user names and passwords. This scenario demonstrates how the ANGEL User Manager and Resource Manager are able to avoid this by using detailed user rights group lists.

Authenticated Networked Guided Environment for Learning



1. A student logs into a VLE from home in order to access course material. He authenticates with his network user name and password. The Angel UM creates a list of rights groups for this user.

4. As long as the resource allows access to one of the groups to which the user belongs they are granted access to the resource.



2. He enters the course links, and selects an external resource. Normally, the student would now need to enter an Athens username and password to access this resource...

3...but because the initial authentication was passed through the Angel User Manager the user does not need to send personal information to the resource in order to log on. Instead, information about the 'rights groups' to which they belong is sent to the RM.
